She also served and chaired numerous committees with Atlantic Shores Baptist Church, community organizations, elementary school, middle school, and high school committees and booster clubs.

Brenda heard about shag lessons at Steppin' Out from her sister and when she walked through the front door she was hooked and began making new friends as she began to dance EVERY night. Brenda was always the first to arrive and the last to leave at club events. She was always ready to lend a helping hand in any capacity. She served food at Sunday Socials, helped decorate, and always stayed for clean-up. Brenda also helped with many club fund raisers, served beer and wine at numerous Beach Music Festival, and at the same time she recruited new shaggers. Working hard for the shag club was a passion. Brenda also served on the by-law committee twice, hospitality committee, special events, and fund-raising committees. She volunteered for demonstration dances at malls and retirement homes. She helped her friends set up a weekly shag outdoor venue at D&M Seafood for two years. She never missed a week.
