While living in Myrtle Beach, Tony held many Board positions in the O. D. Shag Club and was inducted into the "National Living Legends of Dance" in 1997.

Another job change took him to California and the "West Coast Swing" community. Once again, wanting to be current, he took more lessons and learned another new dance style. He danced until his feet nearly fell off. Dancing was truly a way of life for Tony.

Tony not only loved to dance, but was an extremely nice person and was always one of the better dancers, whatever style. He was honored to be selected for the VSHOF and intended to be a very active and participating member. Tony was always very respectful of what it takes to be recognized and selected for the VSHOF.... a love for the dance.

Tony passed away on March 6, 2018.
